Residential Service with Renewable Generation**

AVAILABILITY Available in all territory served by Central Alabama Electric Cooperative, subject to the Cooperative's established Service Rules and Regulations.

APPLICABILITY Applicable only for residential use and for use incidental thereto on a permanent year-around basis, supplied through one meter to each individual residence up to 10KW distributed generation. Equipment must be installed and operational and meet all cooperative requirements for interconnection.

TYPE OF SERVICE Alternating current at approximately 60 cycles per second, single phase, 120/240 volts.

<u>DAILY ACCESS RATE</u>	Access Charge (no kWh included)	\$2.13
kWh CHARGE	Wholesale Power Cost of:	8.11¢/kWh
<u>CAEC PURCHASE RATE</u>	Avoided Cost:	3.372¢/kWh

MINIMUM CHARGE The minimum daily charge shall be \$2.13 for single-phase service.

SINGLE POINT DELIVERY The above rates are based upon the supply of service to the entire premises through a single delivery and metering point, at one voltage. Separate supply for the same Member at other points of consumption or at a different voltage shall be separately metered and billed. Service under this classification is subject to Service Rules and Regulations of the Cooperative.

POWER COST ADJUSTMENT The Energy Charge contained in this rate may be increased or decreased by an increase or decrease in wholesale power cost, operational costs or sales volume experienced by the cooperative during term of agreement. The Board of Trustees may increase or decrease the monthly adjustment as it deems necessary to maintain the financial stability and integrity of the Cooperative.

BILL CALCULATION The daily access charge shall be billed monthly. In addition, the purchased kWh will be billed at the Wholesale Power Cost Rate and the supplied kWh will be credited by the Wholesale Power Cost Rate. If the number is negative (supplied more kWh's than purchased), then a credit will appear for this calculation. If the credit is large enough to offset the access charge, the monthly bill will be a credit and will roll forward to the next month. If a credit remains in Dec of each year, the cooperative shall issue a check for the credit amount.
